



Grace on the Move

Grace rarely arrives on our terms. It comes at midnight, marked in blood on a doorframe, urgent and strange - not gentle sentiment, but rescue on the move (Exodus 12:1-14). God tells a enslaved people to eat standing, sandals on, staff in hand, ready to leave everything they've known. Grace breaks in not as comfort to settle into, but as deliverance that demands we get up and go. The lamb's blood doesn't decorate the house - it marks a boundary between death and life. That's how grace often works: it interrupts before it soothes. But grace isn't only vertical. Matthew 18:15-20 shows grace breaking into our relationships, especially the fractured ones. Jesus gives a process for confronting sin - not to punish, but to win back a brother or sister. Reconciliation is itself an act of grace, patient and deliberate, refusing to let broken relationship have the final word. And where two or three gather in his name, Christ promises his presence - grace breaking into ordinary rooms, ordinary conflicts, ordinary gatherings. Together these texts reveal grace's character: it is urgent, communal, costly, and relational. It doesn't wait for us to be ready. It marks us, rescues us, and then teaches us to live reconciled - with God and with one another. Whose door might your grace need to mark?

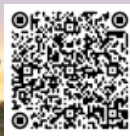

St Agnes: Finance Update

Dear fellow Parishioners.

Following my brief overview of our Parish financial affairs for the first seven months to end July, I wish to highlight a few salient observations. Our Income Statement reveals that our Dedicated Giving and Offertories are currently 14% below budget. This is a significant shortfall. July 2026 was a particularly pleasing result in isolation as we achieved our monthly budgeted income for the first time this year. Thank you!

I pointed out that our reported surplus for the seven months is stated as R 193 000. On the face of it, this would be noted as remarkable. This surplus must be understood in the context of the Diocese writing back R 188 000 of our arrears due to their payment incentive plan. The true seven-month surplus is therefor R 5 000 which in essence, suggests that we have 'broken even' with very little spent on ministry.

We have just come through a season which emphasised the importance of committing to the life of the Parish by signing up as a Dedicated Giver. May I encourage those of you who have signed a pledge, to now convert your covenant to 'faith (that the Lord will provide), and action (I trust the Lord by giving).'

The Parishioner is the 'lifeblood' of any Parish in so many ways, with finances being but one element thereof. By honouring your commitment to the Lord, you contribute to keeping other less fortunate Parishes running, pay the salaries and keep our lights on. All this is of course important but secondary to our mission which is 'to know Jesus and make Him known.'

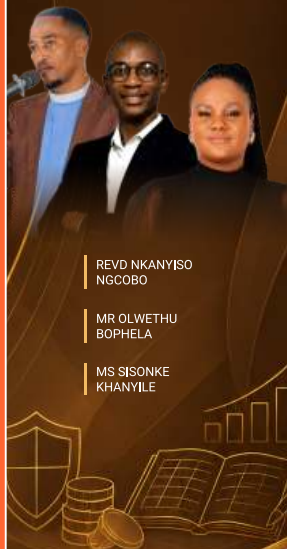

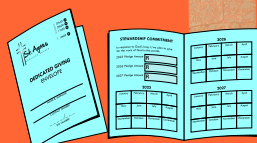
